DESCRIPTION Suitable for all bikes, road/ sealed cycle path

TIME 45 mins - 1.5 hour

VIEW POINTS

A **DUNOLLIE POINT**
Views along the Firth of Lorn & Sound of Mull to the islands

B **GANAVAN**
Views across Loch Linnhe to Morvern, Ardnamurchan Peninsula and Lismore Island

C **DUNSTAFFNAGE**
Views to Loch Etive, Connel Bridge & Ben Cruachan

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ROUTE DESCRIPTION

Setting off from the centre of Oban, this route hugs the shore alongside the sandy beaches of Ganavan, before climbing towards the village of Dunbeg on a traffic-free path.

With castles at Dunollie and Dunstaffnage, and the visitor centre at SAMS (Scottish Association for Marine Science) nearby, this is an excellent opportunity to learn more about the local area.

Alternatively, watch island ferries come and go from the town's busy port, or look out for the resident otters, seals and sea birds along the shoreline.
